Playberry Laser Literacy Program

Last year we informed families that we would be adopting a new way of teaching spelling and reading in 2024. During the week before students returned, all staff went through the training for implementation of the Playberry Laser Literacy Program and have started teaching using this methodology.

Bill outlined that reading and writing are 'biologically secondary' for humans. We have been speaking for as long as we could walk, but concepts of the printed word and making meaning from them have only been a part of our lives for approximately the last 5,000 years.

This program deliberately uses a very explicit and structured manner of teaching to embed the concepts and rules in students memories.

It is worth noting that this program follows all the

same research and principles as those now being advocated and encouraged by the Department for Education.

Last Friday 9 February a number of families attended a morning tea to hear one of the creators of the program, Bill Hansberry, talk about the critical need for students to progress through the scope and sequence in a timely manner.

'Good' readers have between 30-70,000 words orthographically mapped, that is, known instantly by sight, without having to sound them

out.

With so many words able to be read clearly and fluently, readers free up significant working memory to be able to concentrate on the meaning and syntax of the text.

Activities using Playberry Laser also concentrate on correct letter formation, handwriting and working to transfer the concepts of text into students own writing as well.

Water Safety 2024

This week, students from reception to year 5 have been taking part in Water Safety lessons at Adelaide Hills War Memorial Swimming Centre at Woodside.

Apart from some transport issues with the buses to get us there and back it has been a great week with excellent weather for those in the pool!



Buddy Program - Year 6 and Reception Students

Last year our Student Wellbeing Leader, Ashlee, designed a Buddy Program to connect year six leaders with our newest reception students.

The dual aims of this program are to support the reception students in becoming comfortable in their new surrounds, while also developing leadership skills in the older students.

Activities have been timetabled each week and will cover focus points such as; leadership, inclusion, student voice, partnerships, and support.



While 2024 is the first year of this program, we plan for it to be an annual event. In 2030 these newest members of our school will be buddies for reception children who aren't even born yet!

On Friday next week, the year six students will introduce their buddies to the rest of the school at our first assembly. We hope to see you there!














