Education Leaders Day and the Numeracy Summit

I spent Monday and Tuesday this week at two significant dates in the Department for Education's calendar.

Education Leaders Day on Monday, gave school and corporate leaders from across the system an opportunity to further investigate the Learn and Thrive Strategy that is rolling out across the department. More can be found about the strategy here:

Our school is developing a plan to address our response and strategic directions in each of the four *Areas of Impact*:

- Equity and excellence
- Wellbeing
- Effective learners
- Learner agency

A simple thought I took away from Leaders Day was from Sarah Martin, Principal of the purpose built and very impressive Stonehouse School in Auckland, NZ. She repeatedly referred to teachers as causing learning.

I was quite taken with this thought and its implications. To say we *cause learning* seems so much more active and intentional than *teaching*. I look forward to investigating this with staff over the rest of the year.

On Tuesday at the **Numeracy Summit** the focus was on ensuring that maths lessons include time for students to discuss, hypothesize, investigate and justify their response to questions.

We want our students to think about the

type of maths required in order to solve the problem.

If you were asked 'How much milk in the world is there?'

What would be your response? What maths would you use to begin developing an answer? Is oat milk, milk? What other thoughts, processes and decisions do you need to make, to think of possible solutions to a problem as rich and wide ranging as this?

It is crucial these and other analytical and critical skills are developed in our current students by the time they finish their compulsory schooling over the next twelve years.

Pupil Free Day - Berry Street

As previously advised, tomorrow, Friday 8 March is our first pupil free day for the year. The whole staff will be learning with colleagues from Birdwood and Mt Pleasant Primary Schools to develop common understanding of this well renowned trauma informed practice.

Given that one of the four Areas of Impact in the department's strategy applies a focus to Wellbeing, this important work will form a significant part of this quadrant in our future planning.

Road Safety

As a school we are constantly faced with the challenge that the roads around our school provide. Ever since I was appointed at Lobethal, various sections of Mill Road, and its intersection with School Road have concerned me.

There have been a number of 'near HTTPS://www.school.nete.

miss' incidents involving our students already this year.

Recently a car ignored the Emu Crossing, driving straight through despite the monitors signs being correctly displayed. Please always check for yourself when you are crossing Mill Road to ensure a safe crossing.

The Mill Rd intersection with School Rd is also problematic. If traffic is banked down to the intersection and you are turning onto School Rd, either left or right, but especially left, please always leave room between yourself and a car in front of you, to allow students safe passage across School Rd and down to the Emu Crossing.

Finally, there are various other areas of Mill Road our students cross. There is often poor visibility for drivers and pedestrians alike, and I would ask that you are always vigilant in supporting your children to cross safely.

I have begun conversations with both the Adelaide Hills Council and Dan Cregan, Member for Kavel to look for further solutions to solve these ongoing issues and I thank you for your support in ensuring safety for all around our school.

Bike Education

Another step in our support of students to be safe on our roads, is the Bike Education program being run by Bike SA. Students in years four to six will be part of this, beginning on Tuesday 19 March. Further information will be sent out to families of these students this week.
