From the Principal

Dear parents and caregivers,

I was in a meeting yesterday and the presenter mentioned that it was the 3rd of April and my first thought was – we are past a quarter of the way through 2024 already. How can that be? Feedback from Interviews

Please note that this 'exclusion zone' also extends 10 metres outside the school boundary.

I am pleased to say that this is not an area I have been concerned about – I have not had to mention this to anyone in our community in the time I have been here!

Nature Nurture in the garden at Lobethal PS

If you have ventured out the back of the school to the garden area in the last couple of weeks, you will see that it has begun to spring back to life.

Last year, we were lucky enough to secure funding to join the National Student Wellbeing Program (NSWP). The NSWP is delivered by a Pastoral Care Worker or Student Wellbeing Support Officer (SWSO).

The program aims are to:

- provide support that focuses on the social and emotional wellbeing of students
- complement the existing student wellbeing programs and services offered by schools.

Here at Lobethal, we chose to employ an SWSO and focus our on the revitalisation of the garden program. Erin, already an SSO at the school, was employed as our SWSO and has thrown herself into this work with huge enthusiasm!

We are calling this new program Nature Nurture.

The purpose of *Nature nurture* is to provide students with the opportunity to immerse themselves in gardening opportunities that promote self-regulation, nurture, connection with others, and the development of transferable skills that incorporate garden to plate understandings, food preparation and plant usage. This program will highlight four activity domains

- Nature immersion
- Nature & sensory
- Nature creations
- Nature & nurture

Through the program students will enjoy weekly sessions in an enriching outdoor environment that will promote a strong sense of connectedness to our school community, a deeper appreciation for



the natural environment and accrue additional tools to further promote student's own sense of wellbeing and wellness.

We hope to use produce in subsequent cooking sessions and look forward to opening our school gate 'farmers stall' to share with the wider community!

There is always huge excitement in each class as they 'get their hands dirty'!

We look forward to sharing more of this progress with you as the year continues!



District Athletics Carnival
