From the Principal

Dear parents and caregivers,

We are well and truly up and running for Term Two in what is going to be a very busy but exciting time at Lobethal. a broader South Australian Education Department system it is a time of significant change and at a local level we are also implementing and preparing for many new initiatives.

I have previously shared information regarding the 'Learn and Thrive' strategy for the future of public education in our state. Staff at LPS have begun investigating how the Areas of Impact can help guide our future planning

Yesterday I was at a Torrens Valley Partnership meeting, where leaders were introduced to the draft version of the new South Australian Curriculum. While all states have agreed that the Australian Curriculum is the backbone of learning across the country, SA is one of the last states to adapt the framework to the local context.

While this new curriculum is still in draft form at the moment, schools will begin engaging with and using this curriculum over the next couple of years, with full adoption in all learning areas scheduled for 2027.

Over the first quarter of the century, there has been a lot of talk in education circles about preparing our students for the new skills that employers are looking for as our economy and society come to grips with the information revolution that has been instigated by the internet.

In many cases, these employers are not looking so much at content or industry specific knowledge. Rather they are looking for employees who are agile, personable - who can think critically and analytically – and then apply their thinking to a new or unfamiliar context.

One of the core changes to the new SA Curriculum is that dispositions, the attitudes and outlooks students have about themselves and their connection to each learning area are now at the forefront of the Learning Standard. This Learning Standard in turn, is the statement that teachers will use when assessing students at the end of each year. While assessing dispositions, will be new for our teachers, it means that these critical ways of thinking and being will be at the forefront of our work.

The other significant reason for the new curriculum is that it aligns with the values and purpose of the Learn and Thrive strategy.

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From the Principal Continued...

As more information becomes publicly available, I will share with you further details of this new initiative.

Laser Literacy Program

As you are aware, since the beginning of the year, our staff have been delivering the Laser Literacy Program. This explicit, structured phonics and morphology program has been gaining traction with students and staff are becoming more and more confident and precise in their delivery of it.

Last term we had Linda and Christie-Lee from Laser Literacy run a number of demonstration sessions with staff watching. Over the last couple of weeks, we have had Christie-Lee return, but this time she observed staff deliver the program and then meet with them to provide feedback.

The overwhelming feeling among staff has been that this has been a valuable exercise. Christie-Lee was able to highlight small areas of practice that staff can fine tune to make the program run with even more fidelity and accuracy.

Lobethal Primary School Governing Council – Constitution Change

Just before I was appointed as Principal at Lobethal, the Governing Council constitution was changed to mandate a maximum of five parent reps – down from the unwieldy thirteen it have previously been.

Over the course of 2023, council found that this number was too far to the other extreme, with illness and unavailability making meetings hard to schedule with a suitable quorum. It also meant that every member essentially needed to be an office bearer or member of and GC sub-committee.

During Term One, council passed a special resolution to increase the parent reps to a maximum of nine, meaning that up to four new members can be appointed by council for the remainder of this school year.

There have already been two nominations to fill these places, with these appointments due to be ratified at the beginning of the next GC meeting. If you are interested in joining council for a 'taster' for the rest of the year, please contact Mark or the Front Office.

Education Management System

For at least twenty five years, schools in South Australia

have used EDSAS (Education Department School Administration System), as our core database for record keeping, student and family details, finance, asset management and many other crucial business areas.

EDSAS is hosted locally on an independent 'admin' server in each school and has been updated and patched to within an inch of its life! It is no longer fit for purpose, with a constant fear that it could crash irretrievably in one or many schools at any time.

Over the first few years of the decade, the Department for Education has begun rolling out the replacement for EDSAS, the new Education Management System or EMS.

This cloud based solution will change the way we do many tasks and all schools in the state will have made the transition by the end of 2025.

Next week, on 22 May, it is our turn here at LPS to make the switch!

EMS will:

- provide us with a centralised, single student record that will exist throughout each student's public education
- save time with digital alternatives to labour-intensive, paper-based processes by using digital solutions
- allow flexible access for staff, whether it's working from a classroom, the front desk, on the move (in the school yard) or remotely
- reduce system failures and increase system support
- give us access to real time information to make management decisions such as attendance trends

While initially there won't be many indicators to families of this change, as you can see, the benefits to us internally will be significant.

Please bear with us as we make this switch, if there are any teething problems in finance, attendance records or communication over the next few weeks!

As I said at the beginning of this column, it is a busy but exciting time in front of us!


